Class Qualifications:

USEF Dressage Seat Medal Classes - Qualifications for these classes can be seen in Article 1932 of the current USEF Rule Book, 2007.

MSEDA Championships - To enter you must be a current member of MSEDA & provide a copy of the qualifying test ride with your entry. Also, see MSEDA Championship Qualifying rules: MSEDA Rules & Guidelines - 2001 pg14, Article 111.1.3.

Great American/USDF Qualifying Classes - They will be run concurrently with the class level designated. Enter class plus pay the class fee and qualifying class fee for ride to count as a qualifying ride.

Freestyle Music - Cassettes, CD's or tapes must be submitted before 8 a.m. the day of the class. A sound check will be announced Thursday afternoon. Unclaimed music will not be returned.

Friday - Saturday - Sunday Show days - Open classes: Adult Amateur & Junior/Young Riders classes will be split into OPN, AA & JR/YR if there is a minimum of 4 entrants for each class. **Note:** Open, AA, or JR/YR on entry. Management will limit overall class size to 25 entrants.

WARNING

Under Kentucky Law, a farm animal activity sponsor, farm animal professional, or other person does not have the duty to eliminate all risk of injury of participation in farm animal activities. There are inherent risks of injury that you voluntarily accept if you participate in farm animal activities.

Directions: The Kentucky Horse Park is located on Iron Works Pike, north of Lexington. From I-75, take exit 120. From other highways, watch for Kentucky Horse Park signs. Enter main gate entrance of the park, watch for signs to MSEDA stabling (or ask for directions from gate attendant). Incoming trailers will be charged \$5.00 first time only and issued a pass for the duration of the event. Access to stabling and van parking and competition area will be restricted.

Stabling Fees:

All horses must have a stall for the day while on the grounds. Permanent 10 x 10 stall/full doors. Special requests considered but NOT guaranteed. Please note if horse is a stallion or has special needs. **All horses must be out of stabling by Monday 7:00 a.m.**

Bedding: Mr. Dever - 859-233-9702, 8am-9pm each day. May be purchased on the grounds. NO smoking in barn areas.

Late Arrivals: Bring your own bedding if you are planning to arrive after 9pm.
Early Arrivals: Before Tuesday: Absolutely must have permission through the Secretary's Office. The KHP has major shows the weekend before and will NOT be prepared before Monday.

Stall Changes: For safety - MUST go through secretary's office. Horses found in incorrect stall may be moved & owners fined \$50.00.

A NO SHOW will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show!!!!

Important USEF/USDF Rules:

1. All horses MUST have a USEF ID number. They are free of charge from USEF. All horses must have a USDF Horse ID number (HID) or a USDF Lifetime Registration except those horses in Intro or Pas de Deux classes.
2. You must have a USDF non-member identification card or fill out a form for one, if you are not a USDF member.
3. You have 45 seconds to enter the ring after the bell or whistle sounds.
4. Competition numbers MUST be worn at all times when horse is out of the stall. NON-compliance constitutes immediate ELIMINATION.
5. Separate competition number for each horse/rider combination.
6. Horses are limited to a maximum of three dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two dressage rides per day above Fourth Level.
7. Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels at one competition.
8. Ring Stewards are a MUST for Warm-up arenas, schooling areas and competition rings. Besides checking saddlery, Ring Stewards must watch for abuse.
9. Saddlery will be spot-checked in classes of 6 or more immediately after the horse leaves the ring. A new surgical glove will be used to bit check each horse.
10. Swan neck spurs are allowed. Roweled spurs must rotate.
11. Half chaps or leggings are not allowed.
12. Length of whip 110cm or 43.3 inches, includes lash on end.
13. Three competition errors equals elimination.

The USEF strongly encourages all riders to wear protective headgear passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards with harness secured while riding anywhere on the competition grounds. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the USEF, Show Committees, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. (Art. 318.5)

Bridle numbers must be worn at all times on the show grounds!!! This includes NON-competing horses!!!!

Performance Show Awards

Performance Show Awards: Ribbons to 6th place and trophy in open classes. Ties will not be broken in open classes if collective marks remain equal as well as total points. Qualifying classes will not be pinned. Mid-South Championship classes will be awarded prize money. Other classes may be designated as prize money classes. Show management reserves the right to combine, split or cancel classes as entries warrant. If prize money is awarded for a class, it will be divided equally for each class with 60% of amount per class to the Champion and 40% to the Reserve Champion.

A few of over 50 MSEDAs awards are given annually at the show:

* Bridle Bags will be given to the highest scoring horse/rider combination in Training thru Fourth Level & for the winner of the MSEDAs Championship classes.

*\$200 Championship class competitors placing through fourth will receive payback monies of 1st- \$80, 2nd-\$60, 3rd-40, 4th-20.

*The Garth Harrison Memorial Trophy to the Highest Scoring horse/rider combination at the FEI Level.

*American Trakehner Association Ribbon for the highest scoring Trakehner ATA registered.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Management Rules and Procedures

Enties: Friday- Sunday entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis for levels offered and processed in the order recieved. Riders competing in Championship classes will recieve priority in open classes should entries warrant. Only Championship class entries will be guarenteed IF THEY ARE RECIEVED AND ARE CORRECT BY CLOSING DATE. When entering MSEDAs championship classes, you must be a current MSEDAs member and provide a copy of the Qualifying Test ride, **with your entry**. Entries must include all signatures and a copy of all association cards for owner/rider/trainer/horse and must be legible. Include a current coggins in the horse's show name, within 12 months. Health certificate required for out of state horses. **Health Certificates MUST be carried with horse NOT MAILED with entry. As of 5/31/05 the Kentucky State Veterinary Office is enforcing the law that a certificate of veterinary inspection conducted within the previous 150 days is now required for instate horses.** Entries are not considered complete unless a check (US Funds) or credit card number for the full amount made payable to MSEDAs is included. Entry forms may be downloaded from www.showesecretary.com. **Mail Performance Show & Breed Show entries** to Susan Peacock(see page 1 of prize list). **No certified, registered or Express mail requiring signatures accepted.**

Ride Times: Provisional ride times will only be available online at: www.shosecretary.com. Stable charts will also be available online. Long distance calls will NOT be returned for ride times. Official ride times will be available by Thursday at noon at the Horse Show Office.

Scheduling Conflicts: Management reserves the right to limit the number of classes, maximum of 6 classes, at the discretion of the show secretary.

Weather/Accident/Acts of God Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, accident, or Acts of God. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying class being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, accidents or acts. .

Approved headgear: Horse show management recommends that protective head gear be worn at all times **while mounted**.

Parking: Parking Pass (\$5.00 at the gate) must be orimnently displayed. Parking will be in designated areas only, both for trailers and cehicles . Trailer & vehicles allowed only in barn areas while loading and unloading. Non-compliant vehicles will be fined or towed at the owner's expense.

Dogs/Pets: All must be on leash no longer than 6" and attached to a responsible person. A \$50.00 fine may be imposed if this policy is violated.

Food: Food vendors on grounds and fast food nearby.

Management Rules and Procedures

Farrier: On grounds/or on call across from barns by show office. Phone number posted at show office and on barn charts.

Arena/Footing: 20mx60m composite competition & warm-up arenas. Separate lunge arena.

Liability: Neither the Organizing Committee, the Kentucky Horse Park, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the Mid-South Eventing & Dressage Association, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of exhibitors or spectators.

"Every entry at a recognized competition shall constitute an agreement and an affirmation that all participants (which include, without limitation, the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, handler, and the horse), for themselves, their representatives, employees, and agents: (1) shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the association and the local rules of the competition; (2) represents that every horse, rider, driver, and handler is eligible as entered; (3) agree to be bound by the constitution and rules of the USEF and of the competition and will accept as final the decision of the hearing committee on any question arising under said rules, and agree to hold the competition, the USEF and/or their officials, directors, and employees harmless for any action taken; (4) agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, they authorize the USEF and/or the competition management to market, transfer, assign or otherwise make use of any photographs, likenesses, films, broadcasts, cablecasts, audiotapes, or videotapes taken of the horse(s) and participant(s) while on the grounds, incident to, or in transit between the stabling facility and the event site, in any way they see fit for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the event, sport, or the USEF, without compensation to any of them, so long as the use neither jeopardizes amateur status or endorses a specific product or service and hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with use, including any claims to invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation; and (5) agree that they participate voluntarily in the competition fully aware that horse sports and the competition involve inherent dangerous risk of of serious injury or death, and by participating they expressly assume any and all risks of injury or loss, and they agree to indemnify and hold the USEF, the competition and their officials, directors, employees, and agents harmless from and against all claims including for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the competitions, weather or not such a claim, injury, or loss suffered during or in connection with the competitions, weather or not such a claim, injury, or loss related, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of the said officials, directors, employees, or agents of the USEF or competition. The construction and application of USEF rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the USEF must be filed in the New York State. See Article 1502.5."

Before you seal your entry envelope!!

** Have you used the proper entry form??

**Is your entry form signed on ALL THREE boxes on the back?
The trainer box should be signed by the adult responsible for the horse on the show grounds. For JR/YR, this should be the Parent's signature (or the accompanying adult).

**Have you included a LEGIBLE copy of a current Coggins? The Coggins must be dated within the past 12 months from the date of the show. Results and date must be legible.

** Have you included copies of current USEF/USDF cards? If the cards are not for the current competition year, please do not send them. To be registered in Adult Amateur classes, your card must note your amateur status. Both rider and owner must be a member of USEF and a participating member of USDF to ride in qualifying classes to count. Also, your USEF card must denote Dres, CT or Platinum. If it doesn't, you must pay the \$5 breed/discipline fee (Juniors are excluded from this).

**Have you included your check or money order made payable to MSEDAA?

Mail your entry via regular mail only. **ENTRIES MAILED VIA REGISTERED OR CERTIFIED MAIL MAY NOT BE ACCEPTED.

As long as the entry is POSTMARKED no later than the closing date, it is NOT late (unless you have left something out). It doesn't matter when it actually arrives in my mailbox - it's postmark that counts.

Please Note: Any entry that does not include the above by the closing date **will be considered late** and will be assessed a \$30 late fee. Packets and ride times will not be distributed for incomplete entries.

Kentucky Horse Park Rules & Regulations

1. There will be a one-time parking fee of \$5.00 upon arrival at the KHP. Each exhibitor will then receive a parking pass for the duration of the show. All vehicles parking in event area must display parking pass.
2. Exhibitors/competitors/spectators must park within designated areas only. Designated trailer/horse van parking is in the Main Parking lot, in the back rows.
3. **Vehicles are permitted in barn areas for unloading and loading only. FIRE MARSHAL RULE!!!!**
4. The Kentucky Horse Park Police are charged with enforcement of all traffic rules and regulations. Any and all necessary action taken by the Police are within the guidelines set by the Commonwealth of Kentucky to provide a safe environment for everyone to enjoy the Horse Park. Horses and horse-drawn vehicles have the right-of-way at all times and all locations. Observe speed limit of 25mph on all roads and 10mph in barn areas and campground.
5. Golf carts, mopeds, and bicycles are allowed in stable area & most event areas, but are strictly forbidden in the tourist area of the Park. Skateboards are forbidden in all areas of the park. Golf carts & mopeds require a valid drivers license, therefore **no drivers under age 16**. Use of these is a privilege which may be revoked for persistent violations or abuse.
6. Exhibitors; special requests and/or problems must be relayed to show management and not directed to Park personnel. All Park personnel will respond to emergencies promptly.
7. Use of state property and equipment is not permitted by exhibitors or show management unless cleared by the Special Events office in advance.
8. Show management is responsible for damage and/or loss of any Park property by exhibitors participating in their event. Exhibitors will be billed accordingly for those incurring the damage and/or loss.
9. A Park admission ticket is required to tour the park. Tickets may be purchased at the Visitor Information Center.
10. **ALL DOGS** must be on a leash not to exceed six feet in length at ALL times. Loose dogs will be removed by the Lexington Humane Society at the owners expense.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

USEF RULES: LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE, AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING, AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS, AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30 NONMEMBER REGISTRATION FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE; 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK/TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS; 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES; 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION; 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

ELECTRICAL RULE!!!

In compliance with the State of Kentucky Fire Code, the Kentucky Horse Park does not allow any of the following in stalls, barns, or tents:

- * any 2-prong plug appliances
- * any 2-prong plug extension cords
- * light duty cords for indoor use
- * any 3 way adaptors unless specifically made for outdoors
- * any adaptors without 3-prong connections

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Directory* or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF group membership (GM), intercollegiate/interscholastic membership (IM), participating membership (PM), or have a USDF non-member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members (BM) can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their BM.)

Horses competing at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed shows must have either a USDF horse identification (HID) number or a USDF lifetime horse registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USDF recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Regional Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBC) at DSHB competitions, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are Handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for members under 21 (as of December 1 of the current membership year) for \$35. A PM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership (IM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Member Organization (IMO). The membership year is December 1 through November 30. An IM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions, and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF non-member owner/lessee and USDF non-member rider there will be a USDF non-member fee of \$20 and a USDF non-member form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card.

Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the non-member number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF non-member fee. If all the owners of the horse are non-members, only one of the owners must pay the non-member fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no non-member fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF non-member fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF non-members. Competition management is then required to submit the non-member fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID. An HID does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with a LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has a LHR it does not need an HID. A LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for participating membership (PM), business membership (BM), non-member (NM) identification number, horse identification (HID) number, and lifetime horse registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

2009 Great American Insurance Group/ USDF Regional Dressage Championships

In 2009, a single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), licensed by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a GMO is received by April 1 of the prior year.

The 2009 Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF Web site at: <http://www.usdf.org/Programs/RegionalChampionships/index.asp>. Please refer to the 2009 USDF Directory for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:

Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating* Member at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse registration must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record. If a current lease recording is on file with USDF, the lessee is recognized as "owner" for all USDF membership requirements.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- Horse does not have to be breed registered.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (Participating or Business) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

**Participating Members are USDF members who join USDF directly*

2009 Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider. FEI Junior Rider and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only Open divisions. The minimum percentages are as follows:

The 2009 USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed to specifically recognize and encourage the adult amateurs riding at Second Level.

Awards

1. Dover Medal Recipient

The eligible rider with the highest score of 58% or better in the designated Second Level Test Three class or applicable test of choice USDF/Dover Adult Medal class at a participating competition will receive a handcrafted USDF/Dover pewter medal and neck ribbon. Winners will receive a \$20 Dover Saddlery gift certificate for the first three USDF/Dover Adult Medals they win during the 2009 competition season.

2. The USDF/Dover National Merit Award

A USDF/Dover National Merit Award will be awarded to riders winning three USDF/Dover Medals in the same competition year.

3. Year-End Awards

The USDF/Dover Medal National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined from the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year.

The Champion receives a \$1000 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and a Jaguar dressage saddle. The Reserve Champion receives a \$500 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and a Jaguar dressage bridle.

Rider Eligibility

To be eligible, a rider must meet the following criteria:

1. Rider must be a current USDF group, participating or intercollegiate/interscholastic member at the time of the competition.
2. Rider must ride at Second Level Test Three.
3. Rider must be an adult amateur in accordance with Article GR1306 of the USEF rules and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur as of the competition date.

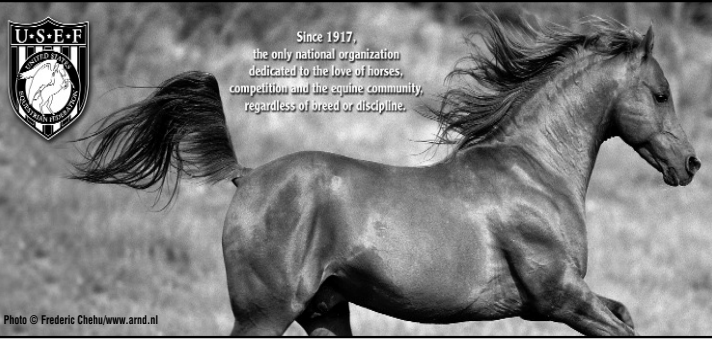
